PREFACE

Gender Equality is a global issue, and discussions on women' emancipation and her rights are at the forefront of many worldwide formal and informal campaigns. As the awareness of gender issues increases, women spontaneously take action against women's oppression and exploitation.

Gender awareness allows women to move beyond other conventional gender stereotypes and rigid gender role definitions.

The gender audit was conducted to identify ways to make college campus safer for women. The audit process involved choosing the sites to be audited, selecting the participants, orientation to the participants, preparing the checklist and the walk —about, writing down the findings and sharing the results with the principal of the college for implementation of the recommendations.







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1. INTRODUCTION

Shri R.P. Gupta, founder of Lala Lajpatrai College of Commerce & Economics, Mumbai, established the College on 23rd July 1972 to open the doors of higher education for youth of Mumbai, especially the Punjabi Community. The college is affiliated to University of Mumbai, Mumbai and is a Punjabi Minority College. The mission is to educate the youth and make them responsible to take active participation in development of India.

The college was re-accredited by NAAC in July 2015 and awarded 'A' grade with 3.01 points.

Gender Audit is an attempt to study observance of gender balance in the college. Another objective is to study whether the college follows all the University rules and policies in relation to gender balance because it forms a constituent part of the University. This Gender Audit tries to check the impact of its current and proposed policies on gender equality.

The college always concentrates on overall personality development of all its students. The college has various Committees/Cells for both boys and girls to develop their personality. Students participate in various intra-college competitions and inter-college competitions including Youth Festival and other National Level Competitions. Their active participation in various competitions gives them an opportunity to showcase and enhance their talents in variousfields.







2. OBJECTIVES OF GENDER AUDIT

Gender Audit of Lala Lajpatrai College of Commerce & Economics, Mumbai, has the following objectives:

- 1. To find out the gender balance existing in different areas.
- **2.** To examine the existing policies of the college, rules/actions towards the needs and interests of all the genders.
- **3.** To check whether the college takes active steps to establish good gender balanceindecisionmakingprocesses in all areas of the college activities.
- **4.** To seek recommendations for bridging the gender gap, if any.
- **5.** To promote growth of gender equality in all aspects.



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3. GENDER SENSITIVE FEATURES OF THE COLLEGE

3.1 In every aspect of system functioning, gender sensitive features are carefully observed. Gender equality is ensured by means of various committees like WDC, Anti-ragging and Internal Complaints Committee. Various steps are taken to promote the development of students, especially girls which are as follows:-

1) Earn and Learn Scheme:

For upliftment and empowerment of students, the college provides student oriented schemes like Earn and Learn Scheme. The students are selected on the basis of economic condition and their needs. The payment is given as per clock hour basis. The college always makes jobs available to the students in various companies through placement to earn and learn.

2) Ladies Room and Wash Room:

Ladies Room provision is made for girls for resting. A notice board is also placed in Ladies Room. Wash Rooms are there with ample water supply and daily cleaning. Sanitary napkins vending machine is installed in girls wash room. A separate wash room is provided to women faculty members.

3) Anti-Ragging:

The College has Anti –ragging committee to ensure that the college campus is free of ragging. Preventive measures are taken by displaying Notices. The names of Committee members along with their mobile numbers and email id are displayed on the notice board for the easy access by the students.







4) Women Development Cell:

The college has a Women Development Cell constituted on the guidelines of University of Mumbai. Its main objectives are as follows:

- To ensure implementation of the directions of University Women Development Cell in the college.
- To provide appropriate work conditions for women and girl students, and to ensure that there is no hostile environment towards women at work place.
- To create social awareness about the problems of women and problems due to gender discrimination.
- To arrange and to distribute all the publications of the University Cell concerning the directions amongst the teachers, non-teaching employees and students.

5) Internal Complaints Committee:

As per rules and regulations the "Internal Complaints Committee" is formed to solve the problems of girl students and women at work place under the title "The Sexual Harassment of women at work place (prevention, prohibition and redressal) Act, 2013"






















